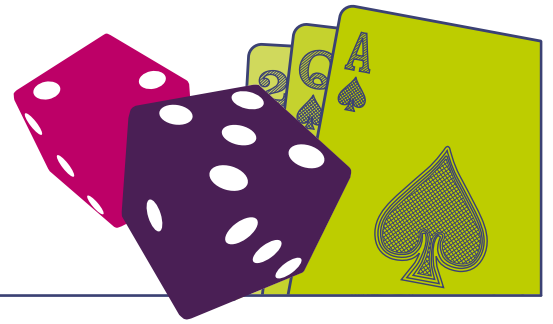

Gemma Hood is a maths researcher at Edinburgh University, who spends her time investigating cosmic topics like black holes and wormholes. She's even worked on Einstein's famous theory of relativity. She was born in Edinburgh but grew up in Livingston. When not thinking about gravity, she can often be found playing videogames from her vast collection.



Ben Sparks is a mathematician, a musician, and a speaker. He gives talks and workshops around the world on the beauty and magic of mathematics, and often performs songs with his guitar as part of the show. He's based at the University of Bath and if his face is familiar, you might have seen him on YouTube's *Numberphile* channel. His current favourite game is *Settlers of Catan*.



Rob Eastaway is an author whose books on maths include the bestselling *Why Do Buses Come In Threes?* and *Maths On The Back of an Envelope*. He is the puzzle adviser for *New Scientist* magazine, and appears regularly on radio and in podcasts to talk about the maths of everyday life.
